Introducción

The country of Haiti has battled longstanding political, economic, and environmental instability for decades. The assassination of President Jovenel Moïse, on July 7th, 2021, has only amplified political unrest and civilian violence. During this current start of upheaval, Haiti also continues to recover from the aftermath of the earthquake on August 14th that resulted in at least 2,248 deaths and 12,763 injuries.² The culmination of these unfortunate events has only amplified the burden of injury on an already limited health care system. This has created an interest from stakeholders within the country to strengthen the current trauma system to address the increase in injuries and violence.

Metodos

Trained Haitian site investigators utilized the Safe Surgery Organizational Readiness Tool (SSORT) to conduct qualitative interviews that analyzed staff beliefs and attitudes towards implementation of trauma system strengthening interventions. The SSORT is designed to identify potential barriers to implementation and maximizes the chances for intervention success.

Resultados

Nineteen facility members at HUEH completed the SSORT. The findings highlighted a strong overall belief that the facility needs change, and the proposed implementation of trauma care interventions would be appropriate to create positive change. Concerns were seen regarding the potential resistance to change, psychological safety of those who support the intervention, facility learning environment, and resource availability related to funds, human resources, equipment and supplies, infrastructure, and information management.

Conclusiones

The SSORT allowed our team to identify barriers to be mitigated or aware of prior to implementation of trauma system strengthening interventions in Haiti. Identifying individual, team, and organizational factors and challenges before implementation creates an opportunity to tailor interventions and maximize success.
