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Background



• Surgical referrals: a referral for surgical services made from one hospital to a higher level hospital

Purpose: Determine the most common reasons for surgical referral.




Methods

- Descriptive cross-sectional study
- Location: 5 primary-level hospitals in Amhara, Ethiopia

Included all reasons for emergency & elective referrals in May

2018 (total of 31 days)





Findings


